MEASURES AND INITIATIVES TO PREVENT AND COMBAT RAGGING

At MBITS, with the strong support of authorities and active involvement of student bodies, several strategies have been put in place to prevent ragging and address any incidents effectively. These anti-ragging measures are designed to create a safe, supportive, and welcoming environment where students can focus on their education without fear or intimidation. Key measures include:

- Anti-Ragging Committees and Squads: Establishing an Anti-Ragging Committee and an Anti-Ragging Squad comprising faculty, staff, and student representatives to oversee the implementation of anti-ragging policies.
- Awareness Campaigns: Conducting regular awareness campaigns, workshops, and seminars to educate students about the harmful effects of ragging and its legal consequences.
- Monitoring and Reporting: Implementing strict monitoring mechanisms, such as CCTV surveillance, regular patrols by anti-ragging squads, and setting up complaint boxes and helplines for anonymous reporting.
- Orientation Programs: Including anti-ragging guidelines and awareness sessions in orientation programs for new students to inform them about the institution's zerotolerance policy on ragging.
- Strict Disciplinary Actions: Enforcing stringent disciplinary actions against those found guilty of ragging, which may include suspension, expulsion, or legal action as per the regulations.
- Legal Awareness: Informing students about the legal provisions against ragging, including consequences under the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and other relevant laws.
- Collaboration with Law Enforcement: Coordinating with local law enforcement agencies to ensure prompt action in case of serious ragging incidents.
- Continuous Improvement: Regularly reviewing the effectiveness of anti-ragging measures and incorporating feedback from students and staff to improve strategies.
